

General Description.

Nearly all of this tp. is mountainous and unfit for cultivation, the only level land, or land with uniform slope is in the southern and southeastern part. The southeast corner contains too much alkali for cultivation. Above this and bordering on the mountains is a strip of land from one to two miles in width which is very good; uniform S. E. slope, fertile soil, and not too much alkali. There is no water available to irrigate any portion of it except a small part of sec. 34, which could be irrigated from a small spring in this section. It is not probable that farming would be successful without irrigation. Nearly all of the mountainous part is more or less mineralized. It being strongest in secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14, where the indications are that there is gold and silver bearing ore, and in the N. W. and western part of the tp. where copper ore and indications thereof seem to predominate.
