line. It is a redwood post 3×3 ins. by 16 ins. above ground, firmly set in the ground in a mound of earth and marked with 3 notches on the E. and W. edges.

I continue my blank line east. At 40.33 chs. I find the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. falling 16 links S. of my line.

It is a redwood post 3×4 ins. by 18 ins. above ground, firmly set in the ground in a mound of earth, and marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. face. At 81.46 chs. I find the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35; falling 40 links S. of my line. It is a redwood post 3×3 ins. by 2 ft. above ground, firmly set in the ground in a mound of earth. The markings are so nearly obliterated as to be undecipherable.

I continue my blank line east. At 40.60 chs. I find the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. falling 50 links S. of my line.

It is a redwood post 3×3 ins. by 12 ins. above ground, firmly set in the ground in a mound of earth and marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. face. At 81.60 chs. I find the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36; falling 60 links S. of my line. It is a basalt stone $22 \times 10 \times 6$ ins. Set in a mound of stone and marked with 5 notches on W. and 1 notch on E. edge.

I continue my blank line east. At 40.10 chs. I find the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. falling 66 links S. of my line.

It is a redwood post, 3×3 ins. by 14 ins. above ground, firmly set in the ground in a mound of earth and stone and marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. face.

At 81.70 chs. I find the cor. of Tps.
