August 4, 1911: From the temp. peg, set by me on August 2, 1911. to mark the proper point, for closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2. T.39 N., R.18 E. I run East., on a blank line, on the S. bdy. of sec. 35. T.40 N., R.18 E. by fore and back sights.

- ✓ 36.48 Find no trace of old 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 35. which is described as a trap stone 27x21x15, in a mound of stone 4 ft. in diam. at base, by 2 ft. in height.
- ✓ 76.48 I again make a careful search for old cor. of secs. 35 and 36. but am unable to find any trace of old cor.
- 79.48 After a diligent search, I am unable to find any trace of old closing. cor. of Tps. 39 N., R.18, 19 E.
- ✓ 116.48 After a diligent search. find no trace of old 1/4 sec. cor. of sec 36.
- ✓ 153.18 Fall N. of closing. cor. of secs. 5 and 6. T.39 N., R.19 E. 3.04 chs. dist., which is a trap stone, 14x12x8, in a mound of stone, 2-1/2 ft. base, 1-1/2 ft. high, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.
- 156.48 According to distances is the proper point for cor. of Tps. , 40 N., Rs. 18, 19 E. which is described by the Surveyor General as a trap stone 10x12x24, in a mound of stone 2-1/2 ft. high. 6 notches E.W.N. After a diligent search, find no trace of stone or mound of stone. I there fore make a careful search 5.04 chs. W. of closing. cor. of secs. 5 and 6.
