At 26.28 chs., I make a careful search for standard cor. of secs. 31 and 32, which is described as a trap stone, 10x12x14, in a mound of stone, but am unable to find any trace of stone or mound of stone, at 77.00 chs. I fall S. of standard cor. of secs. 32 and 33., 4.20 chs. dist., which is a trap stone, 10x11x17 ins., marked SC. on N., with 4 grooves on E, and 2 grooves on W.face, in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 1-1/2 ft. high. at 117.09 chs. fall S. of standard 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 33, 4.25 chs. dist., which is a trap stone 8x8x10 ins., marked S C 1/4 on N. face, no trace of pits or mound, at 156.92, fall S. of standard cor. of secs. 33 and 34, 4.19 chs. dist., which is a trap stone, 9xl1x14 ins. marked S C on N., with 3 grooves on E., and 3 grooves on W. face, in a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 ft. high at 196.92, I make a careful search for standard 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 34, but am unable to find any trace of old cora, at 276.92, fall S. of a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1/2 ft. high, 4.30 Chs. dist., but am unable to find any trace of marked stone. I therefore continue my blank line East for 436.92 chs., and make a
