

September 10, 1911: From the Standard ^{Top.} Cor. to T.41 N.,
and R.18, 19 E. previously reestablished by me, I run north
on a blank line, along the E. bdy. of T.41 N., R.18 E.
At 40.00chs. I find no trace of old 1/4 sec. cor. bet. secs.
31 and 36. which is described. as a trap stone 10x14x16,
8 ins. in the ground, with 2 pits. At 80.00 chs. find
no trace of cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36. which is des-
cribed. as a trap stone 12x12x24, 12 ins. in the ground,
with 4 pits. At 120.00 chs. find no trace of old 1/4
sec. cor. bet. secs. 25 and 30. which is described as a
trap stone 8x10x15, 7 ins. in the ground, with 2 pits.
At 160.00 chs. find no trace of old cor. of secs. 19, 24,
25 and 30. which is described as a trap stone 10x8x20,
10 ins. in the ground, with 4 pits. At 200.00 chs. find
no trace of old 1/4 sec. cor. bet secs. 19 and 24, which
is described as a trap stone 10x14x22, 10 ins. in the
ground, with 2 pits. At 240.00 chs. find no trace of
old cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24. which is described
as a trap stone 12x12x26, 12 ins. in the ground, with
4 pits. At 280.00 chs. find no trace of old 1/4 sec. cor.
bet. secs. 13 and 18. which is described as a trap stone
8x10x18, 8 ins. in the ground, with 2 pits. At 320.00chs.
find no trace of old cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, which
is described as a trap stone 8x10x24, 12 ins. in the
ground, with 4 pits. At 360.00 chs. find no trace of old
1/4 sec. cor. bet. secs. 7 and 12, which is described as a
trap stone 6x10x12, 6 ins. in the ground, with 2 pits.
