General Description.

This township contains land ranging from barren mountains to good, level land. Running through the township in a northerly and southerly direction with a gentle, uniform N. slope is a strip of good, fertile land, it has at some time in the past, in all probability been the bed of the Walker River, which at that time drained into the Carson river. The Goldfield and Tonopah branch of the Southern Pacific R.R. follows this strip of land. It might be possible to successfully dry-farm on this land although I doubt it.

In secs. 33 and 34 is some good level, mesa land, but it could not be cultivated without irrigation. There is no water available at the present time for that purpose.

In the eastern and south eastern part of the township there is considerable bunch grass and it is of some value for grazing. The rest of the township is barren.
