Resurvey of portion of W. Bdy. of T.36 N., R. 62 E., and  
Retracement of N. Bdy. of T.36 N., R.62 E.

Chains

Rich, moist, black loam along the creek bottoms.  
On the remainder of the mile the soil is clay, sand and gravel mixed. Scattering boulders.  
Dense willows and aspen along the creek.  
Heavy sage, service and buck brush on the remainder of the mile. Some grass.

- North on the E. bdy. of sec. 1, T.36 N., R.61 E.  
Ascending steep SE. slope.
- 30.40 Spur, 295 ft. above section corner, bears E. and W.  
Enter dense timber, bears E. and W.
- 35.00 Draw, 70 ft. below spur, course W.
- 40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 1 only, with brass cap mkd:

- and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor.
- 47.80 Spur, 170 ft. above draw, bears W.
- 53.00 Little draw, 60 ft. below spur, course W.
- 55.00 Little spur, 25 ft. above draw, bears NW.
- 59.50 Draw, 50 ft. below spur, course S.25°W.
- 78.49 Intersect the old township corner, heretofore described, which has been reestablished for two townships only, as follows:  
Alongside of the old rock corner, I set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., on solid rock and in a mound of stone for the cor. of Tps. 36 N., Rs. 61 and 62 E., with brass cap mkd:

- from which:  
A cedar 12 ins. in dia. bears S.78°30'E., 24 lks. dist., mkd. T36NR62E S6BT.  
A mountain mahogany 8 ins. in dia. bears S.52°W., 20 lks. dist., mkd. T36NR61E S1BT.  
Note: This corner was reestablished on May 13, 1915.  
Land, mountainous.  
Soil is very rocky. Clay, sand and gravel with a little loam. Mostly decomposed rock.  
Timber is juniper, mountain mahogany and pinon pine.  
Sage, buck and service berry brush. A little grass.  
June 23, 1915.

## Retracement of N. Bdy. of T.36 N., R.62 E.

- May 6, 1915: From the old cor. of Tps. 36 and 37 N., Rs. 61 and 62 E., I run
- 38.90 S.89°54'E. on a retracement between secs. 6 and 31.  
After diligent search find no trace of old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.
- 76.52 The old cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32 bears S. 68 lks.  
It is a granite stone 22x16x5 ins., lying on the ground with 5 notches on the E. and 1 notch on the W. edges.  
Course of this mile is S.89°23'E.  
I continue on the same line,  
S.89°54'E. retracing between secs. 5 and 32.
- 40.00 After diligent search find no trace of old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.
- 79.16 The old cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33 bears S. 60 lks.  
It is an old cedar post marked as described by the Surveyor General, and lying on an old mound of earth
