


Subdivision of T.36 N., R. 62 E.

37.

Chains



from which:

A pinon pine 14 ins. in dia., bears S.76°E., 26 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S1BT.

A pinon pine 6 ins. in dia. bears S.72°30'W., 71 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S2BT.

40.50 Little draw, 10 ft. below spur, course W.


54.80 Old road, bears E. and W.

66.40 Spur, 150 ft. above draw, bears SW.

70.00 Little draw, 20 ft. below spur, course SW.

80.71 Intersect the N. bdy. of the Tp., 120 ft. above draw, 215 lks. S.89°44'E. of reestablished cor. of secs. 35 and 36, heretofore described.

At point of intersection, set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd:



from which:

A pinon pine 6 ins. in dia., bears S.82°30'E., 85 lks. dist., mkd. T36NR62ES1BT.

A cedar 8 ins. in dia., bears S.35°15'W., 102 lks. dist., mkd. T36NR62ES2BT.

Land, heavily rolling.

Soil is the same as the previous mile, except that it becomes more stony toward the north end. Many volcanic boulders at the north end of the mile.

Timber, juniper, cedar and pinon pine. Sagebrush.

A little grass.

Not on meridian at noon this day.

May 13, 1915.

May 14, 1915: At 7 h 0 m a.m., l.m.t., at the cor. of secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18, I set off 41°01'N. on the lat. arc; 18°29'N. on the decl. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar.

From this corner the SE. cor. of Bew's house bears S.62°50'W.

The SE. cor. of Bew's barn bears S.68°50'W.

Thence I run

West on a true line between secs. 7 and 18.

Over level ranch land.

18.30 Wire fence, bears N. and S.

19.40 Clover valley road, bears N. and S.

19.90 Irrigation ditch, bears N. Ascend.

20.00 Point for old 1/16 sec. cor. No evidence of old cor. found.

The SE. cor. of Bew's barn bears S.8°20'W.

The SE. cor. of Bew's house bears S.6°05'W.

23.00 Telephone line, bears N. and S.

28.00 The N.E. Cor. of John Schore's house bears S.0°45'E.

The N.E. Cor. of John Schore's bunk house bears S.1°10'W.

The N.E. Cor. of John Schore's barn bears S.0°10'W.

28.50 South point of ridge, bears N. and S. 140 ft. above section corner.

30.00 Enter scattering juniper timber, bears N. and S.

37.00 Road, bears N.60°W. and S.60°E.

39.50 Angel creek, 7 lks. wide, 3 ins. deep, course S.60°E.; 90 ft. below ridge. Strip of cottonwood, about 1 ch. wide along creek.

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:
