R.19 E., and at point of intersection set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the C.C. of Ts. 38 and 39 N., R. 20 E., with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, E. of cor.  
 East 39 chs. rolling mountainous; next 34 chs. very rough; remainder creek bottom.  
 Drainage of rougher portions SW. and of creek bottom South.  
 Soil of rolling portion sandy loam and very stony.  
 Soil of very rough portion very rocky with much coarse rubble and places where are bare rocks.  
 Soil of creek bottom ranges from heavy alkaline soil to decomposed granite. Heavy sagebrush on rougher parts and heavy rabbit brush on creek bottom. Some grass on entire mile. No timber. August 1, 1914.

RESURVEY OF E. BDY. T.39 N.,R.20 E.

July 21: At 1 h 20 m P.M., l.m.t., I set off 41°12.5' on the lat. arc and 20°32'N. on the decl. arc and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of Tps. 38 and 39 N., Rs. 20 and 21 E., which is a limestone 15x13x2 ins. above a mound of earth and stone and marked with 6 grooves on the N., S., E. and W. faces, with indications of four pits, NE., SE., SW., and NW. of cor. 6 ft. dist. This corner is in long. 119°42'W.

Thence I retrace North between secs. 31 and 36.

40.00 After diligent search I find no trace of ¼ sec. cor.

80.40 Fall 1.12 chs. West of the old cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, - a granite stone 18x10x5 ins. lying against the E. side of a mound of stone 46 ins. base, 10 ins. high. The corner stone is marked with 5 grooves on the N. and 1 groove on the S. face.

The mile therefore is N.0°48'E., 80.41 chs.

On July 21 and 22, I finish the retracement of this bdy. and, as I find many corners missing and the bdy. very defective in alignment, measurement and position, and as no subdivisions are dependent upon this line, I decide to make an independent resurvey, destroying all old corners found. July 21 and 22, 1914.

July 23: From the corner of Tps. 38 and 39 N., Rgs. 20 and 21 E., heretofore described, I run North on a true line bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over mountainous land, through scattering mahoganies. Descend 70 ft. on NE. slope to draw.

4.90 Draw, course N.60°W., ascend 50 ft. on SW. slope to top of ridge.

22.00 Ridge, bears N.70°W. and S.70°E., descend 135 ft. on N. slope to draw.

29.00 Leave mahoganies, bear E. and W.

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

41.50 Draw, course N.65°W.; ascend 70 ft. on S. slope to top of ridge.
