## Subdivision of T. 39 N., R. 20 E.

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor.

This mile consists partly of gently undulating land and partly of land almost level.

The soil is a rich sandy loam, with much gravel, produces heavy sagebrush and some bunchgrass and is excellent for cultivation if water can be applied. No timber.

- 40.00 N.  $89^{\circ}59'$  E. on a random line between secs. 1 and 12.  
Set a temporary  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.
- 79.84 Intersect the East Bdy. of the township 6 lks. South of the cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, heretofore described. Thence I run  
S.  $89^{\circ}56'$  W. on a true line between secs. 1 and 12.  
Over rolling land.
- 4.64 Draw, course SW.
- 39.92 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

- dig pits  $18 \times 18 \times 12$  ins., E. and W. of post 3 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, N. of cor.
- 79.84 The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12.  
This mile is on rolling land. The soil is a rich, sandy loam with a heavy growth of sagebrush. The land is suitable for agriculture if water can be applied.  
No timber.

- 40.00 N.  $0^{\circ}1'$  W. on a random line between secs. 1 and 2.  
Set a temporary  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.
- 80.07 Intersect the North bdy. of the township 16 lks. East of the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, heretofore described. Thence I run  
S.  $0^{\circ}8'$  E. on a true line between secs. 1 and 2.  
Over rolling land.
- 40.07 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with a brass cap mkd:

- 75.85 Dry wash, 10 lks. wide, 7 ins. deep, course S.  $80^{\circ}$  W.
- 80.07 The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12.  
This mile is on rolling land. The soil is sandy loam and gravelly, but of little depth. It produces a fair growth of sagebrush and some bunchgrass. No timber.

July 28, 1914.

- July 27: From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, on the South bdy. of the township, which is a volcanic stone  $23 \times 12 \times 2$  ins., standing in a mound of stone 35 ins. base, 20 ins. high, and marked with 2 grooves on the E. and 4 grooves on the W. face, I run  
N.  $0^{\circ}2'$  W. between secs. 34 and 35.  
Descend gradually on rolling land.
- 17.50 A gulch, dry, course N.  $55^{\circ}$  W.
- 26.70 Bordwell Springs bear N.  $84^{\circ}$  W. about 30 chs. dist.
- 40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with a brass cap mkd:
