

## 2. Resurvey of E. Bdy. T. 39½ N., R. 20 E.

Chs.

N. slope to section corner.

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.

80.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, with brass cap mkd:

T39½N	T40N

S24	S19
S25	S30

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.

This mile is on rolling mountainous land draining to the east. The soil is very stony and unfit for cultivation. There is a sparse growth of sagebrush and bunchgrass. No timber.

August, 17, 1914.

October 30: From the cor. of Secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, above described, I run

North between secs. 19 and 24.

10.50 Over rolling land. Descend 40 ft. on N. slope to draw. Draw, course N.20°E.; ascend 10 ft. on SE. slope to top of spur.

13.00 Low spur, projects NE.; descend 90 ft. on NE. slope to corner.

37.30 To a point 20.61 chs. east of the SE. corner of T. 40 N., R. 20 E., described in Book "B", at which point I set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for the NE. corner of T. 39½ N., R. 20 E., with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, SW. of cor.

This line is on rolling land sloping N. The soil is a fertile sandy loam, but with many stones. There is a fair growth of sagebrush and bunchgrass. No timber.
