Subdivision of T.39½ N., R. 20 E.

Chs.

At this corner I set off 11°53' N. on the decl. arc, and at about 12 h 3 m P.M., l.m.t., observe the sun on the meridian. The resulting latitude is 41°20'.

40.00 N.89°58'E. on a random line between secs. 22 and 27.
Set a temporary ¼ sec. cor.
79.98 Intersect the N. and S. line 2 lks. N. of the cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27.
Thence I run
S.89°59'W. on a true line between secs. 22 and 27.
Over rolling mountainous land. Descend 270 ft. on SW. slope to section corner.

39.99 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 19 ins. in the ground to bedrock^{and} in a mound of stone for ¼ sec. cor. with a brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor.

79.98 The cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28.

This mile is on a gently sloping mountain side. The soil is very rocky and unfit for cultivation. There is a fair growth of sagebrush and some bunchgrass. No timber.

August 22, 1914.

October 29: From the cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28, heretofore described, I run
N.0°2'W. between secs. 21 and 22.

Over gently rolling mountain top. Ascend 60 ft. on SW. slope to Closing Corner.

37.38 Intersect the South Bdy. of T.40 N., R. 20 E., at a point 20.66 chs. East of the cor. of secs. 33 and 34, and at point of intersection set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam., 15 ins. in the ground to bedrock^{and} in a mound of stone for Closing Corner of secs. 21 and 22, with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, S. of cor.

This line is on a gently rolling mountain top sloping SW. The soil is very stony and rocky and unfit for cultivation. There is a sparse growth of sagebrush and bunchgrass. No timber.

19.34 From the Closing Corner of secs. 21 and 22, I run East on a blank line on the N. Bdy. of sec. 22.
The ¼ sec. cor. referring to sec. 34, described in book "B", on line.

39.98 At this point, which is the middle point of the N. Bdy. of sec. 22, I set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 23 ins. in the ground to bedrock^{and} in a mound of stone for ¼ sec. cor. referring to sec. 22, with brass cap mkd:
