GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The western part of this township consists of mountainous land draining northerly and northeasterly. The northeastern part is also rough and high. Between these two parts and with the land sloping down to it gradually from both sides is a low pass. The southeastern part of the township is gently rolling.

The soil of the entire township is exceptionally rocky with the exception of the gently rolling portion in the southeast, which has a fertile sandy loam soil.

There is juniper and mahogany timber, very scattering in nearly all of the rougher parts, and a considerable quantity of mahogany timber in the northwest part. In the valleys in the southwest part, which is very high, there is much aspen timber. There is heavy sagebrush in the southeastern part and low scattering sagebrush in the remainder of the township.

The township has an abundance of water and is well adapted to grazing.

There are no settlers in the township.
