21.00 40.00 50.70 80.00	<p>East on the S. Bdy. of sec. 35. Ascend very gradually on gently rolling mountain top, sloping SW.</p> <p>Ridge, bears N. and S. Descend 220 ft. on E. slope to gulch.</p> <p>Set a volcanic stone 19x7x7 ins., 14 ins. in the ground for the ¼ sec. cor., referring to sec. 35, mkd. ¼ on N. face, and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor. Iron post impracticable.</p> <p>A gulch, dry, course S., ascend 240 ft. on NW. slope to corner.</p> <p>Top of ascent.</p> <p>Set a basalt stone 16x14x7 ins., 11 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 35 and 36, mkd. with 1 groove on the E. and 5 grooves on the W. face, and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor. Iron post impracticable.</p> <p>The W. 27 chs. of this mile lies on a gently rolling mountain top with a very stony soil and almost no vegetation except for a few scattering mahogany trees on the ridge at 21 chs. The E. 53 chs. is much steeper, but has a better soil, it being a sandy loam but with some outcroppings of large rocks. There is a heavy sage on the E. 53 chs.</p> <p>Oct. 28, 1914.</p>
6.00 40.00 65.50 80.00	<p>October 30: From the cor. of secs. 35 and 36, above described, I run East on a true line on the S. Bdy. of sec. 36. Along top of mountain.</p> <p>Descend 460 ft. on NE. slope to draw.</p> <p>Set a basalt stone 18x10x8 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for the ¼ sec. cor. referring to Sec. 36, mkd. ¼ on N. face, and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor. Iron post impracticable.</p> <p>Draw, course N.30°E.; thence over gently rolling land.</p> <p>Set a basalt stone 21x10x5 ins., 16 ins. in the ground, for the SE. cor. of Tp. 40 N., R. 20 E., on the N. Bdy. of Tp. 39½ N., R. 20 E., mkd. T40NR20E on NW. face, with 6 notches on the N. and W. edges, and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, NW. of cor. Iron post impracticable.</p> <p>The W. 6 chs. of this mile is on a rolling mountain top; the E. 24.50 chs. is on rolling lowland, and the remainder is on a rather steep NE. mountain side. The soil ranges from a fertile sandy loam to gravelly and rocky. There are patches of heavy sage in many places on the mile. No timber.</p> <p>October 30, 1914.</p>
