

This fractional township is rough and mountainous on the east, south and west, the central portion is low hills and rolling ground.

The formation of the mountainous land is granite. The rolling land is a deep sandy soil, with sagebrush as the only vegetation. The vegetation in the mountains is sagebrush, scattering junipers, and a scant growth of bunchgrass. The mountains would be valuable as grazing land for short time in the early part of the summer.

The only water in this fractional township is in section 23, near the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sections 22 and 23. This well belongs to Niel West, who has a house and corral near the well. The corral has been used for roundup purposes, but, now abandoned.

There are no settlers in this fractional township. There has been considerable prospecting done in sections 13, 24, 3, 10, 15, 22 and 27. The mineral indications are copper and gold.
