This township contains mountainous and level lands. In the S.E. portion is an alkali flat or old lake bed, the soil here is an alkali clay, mixed with some sand; 4th rate. Along the west portion of the S. Bdy. and in the extreme S.W. corner of the township it is rolling, loose sandy land. The remainder of the township consists of a high, rough, volcanic mountain, covered with a very short sparse growth of shadscale, sage and grasses. The soil is very rocky, mixed with some light sandy loam; the surface is covered with volcanic rock, which can all be classed from 3rd to 4th rate.

There is no timber nor water within the township.

The old Southern Pacific R.R. track from Fernley to
Leete Salt Works, an old immigrant trail of '49, also
the transcontinental Bell Telephone line, crossés the
S.E. portion of the township.

There is an old well in Sec. 33 along the road, which

affords fairly good water.

There are no settlers, nor indications of mineral in this township.
