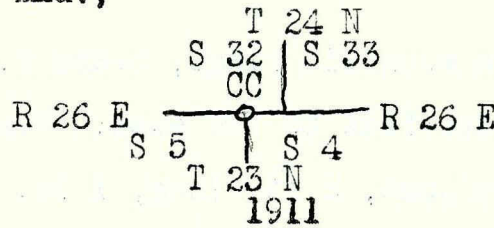


SUBDIVISION OF T.23 N., R.26 E.

Chains NO°05'E on a random line bet. secs. 4 and 5.
 40.00 Set a temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
 80.85 Intersect N. bdy. of the tp., 100 lks. W. of the cor. of
 secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33, heretofore described. At the
 point of intersection
 I set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in
 the ground, for closing corner to secs. 4 and 5 with
 brass cap mkd.;

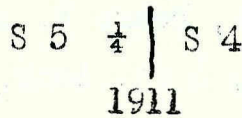


and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high,
 S. of cor.

Thence, I run from C.C.

S0°05'W on a true line bet. secs. 4 and 5;

0.30 Dry wash 10 lks. wide, course, N.E.; ascend.
 30.80 Top of high ridge, bears E. and W.; descend.
 39.70 Gulch and dry wash, 50 lks. wide, course, E.
 40.85 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the
 ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.;
