GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The surface of this township embraced in the field notes of the foregoing survey is very rough mountainous land for the most part, except the northern tier of sections wherein the ground is heavily rolling. The soil is generally sandy and gravelly in the low portions and rocky on the mountain sides and tops.

There is little or no grass, neither is there any water in the township. The only apparent value the land of this township seems to have is that of the mineral it may contain, distinct evidences of which exist in sections 13, 14, 23, 24 and 26.

There is no timber, the only vegetation being a low desert brush. At the present time there are no settlers in the township.

The surface of this township consists of land very heavily broken and rolling. The soil is a heavy sand mixed with gravel and rock. It supports no vegetation other than that of a low, thorny, desert brush. It is almost devoid of grass. There is no living water in the township. Its only value would seem to be for the mineral it may contain.
