

## RESURVEY OF THE EAST BOUNDARY OF T.26 N., R. 29 E.

Chains.	Retracement.
	<p>On October 31, 1911, I retraced the East boundary of T.26 N., R.29 E. as follows;-</p> <p>From the standard cor. of T. 26 N., Rs. 29 and 30 E., heretofore described, I run North on the E. bdy. of sec. 36.</p>
39.13	<p>Old <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. bears E. 1.09 chs.; a basalt rock, 8x8x8 ins., set loosely in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.</p>
79.85	<p>Old cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, bears E. 1.13 chs.; a basalt rock, 20x8x8 ins., loosely set in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.</p>
	<p>Thence, I continue retracement line North on E. bdy. of sec. 25.</p>
40.22	<p>Old <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor., bears E. 1.10 chs.; a basalt rock, 18x12x5 ins., set loosely in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.</p>
80.45	<p>Old cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, bears E. 1.00 ch.; a basalt rock, 12x12x6 ins., set loosely in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.</p>
	<p>Thence, I continue retracement line North on E. bdy. of sec. 24.</p>
40.00	<p>After diligent search, I find no trace of old <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor.</p>
81.10	<p>Old cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, bears E. 1.25 chs.; a basalt rock, 10x8x3 ins., set loosely in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.</p>
	<p>Thence, I continue retracement line North on E. bdy. of sec. 13.</p>
40.00	<p>Old <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. bears E. 99 lks.; a basalt rock, 10x8x3 ins., set loosely in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.</p>
