Chains and raise a mound of stone
 2 ft. base 1 1/2 ft. high S. of cor.
 Land rolling
 Soil, gravelly 2nd rate
 Undergrowth, sage and desert brush.
 No timber
 Sept. 11, 1912

Retracement of W. bdy. T 30 N., R. 30 E.
 Sept. 11, 1912: Lt. 8h. a.m., l.m.t.
 Set of 40° 25' N. on the
 lat. arc; 4° 34' N. on the
 decl. arc; and determine
 a meridian with the solar
 at the cor. of Tps. 29 and 30
 N., R's 29 and 30 E. heretofore
 described.

Thence I retrace north bet
 secs. 31 and 36

The old 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 31
 and 36 which is a quartzite rock
 6x9x9 ins. above ground, firmly set,
 marked and witnessed as
 described by the Surveyor General,
 bears East 2 lks.

The course of this half miles
 is therefore N 0° 2' E.

 The old cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36
 which is a quartzite rock 6x9x9
 ins. above ground, firmly set,
 marked and witnessed as
 described by the Surveyor General,
 bears East 6 lks.

The course of last 1/2 mile is
 therefore N. 0° 2' E.
