

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The northeastern portion of the township, contains some very rough mountainous land. The balance of the township is composed mainly of very rough broken land, with frequent ridges, hills and draws, the drainage being toward the large main wash passing southeasterly through the center of the township.

There is no sign of any timber in the township, the only vegetation being the usual desert brush, more or less scattered. The soil is mainly sandy, containing no loam, and in places cemented with clay.

There are distinct evidences of mineral in the mountains in the northeastern part of the township, the formation being mainly volcanic with frequent outcrops of granite disclosed.

There is no water in the township, nor are there any settlers.
