

RESURVEY OF THE NORTH BOUNDARY OF T. 32 N., R. 31 E.

Chains

81.74 (Proportional distance) Set a schist rock, 20x14x4 ins., 16 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 31 and 32, marked with 5 notches on E. and 1 notch on W. edge; and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor. Iron post impracticable.

Land mountainous.

Soil part rocky; 4th. rate; part rocky mixed with some loam; 3rd. rate.

Juniper timber 30.00 chs.; remainder of mile desert brush.

Mountainous land 81.74 chs.

S89°55'W. on S. bdy. of sec. 31. Ascend through junipers.

11.00 Top of spur ridge, bears N.E. and S.W.

28.00 Bottom of gulch, course, N.E. Ascend.

28.50 Point, whence, small spring of pure water, bears S. 35 lks.

40.87 (Proportional distance) Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 24 ins. in the ground, for ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 31, with brass cap mkd.;

54.80 Summit of main range of mountains, about 2400 ft. above the N.E. cor. of the tp. bears N.W. and S.E. Descend S.W. slope.

62.00 Cross head of gulch, bears S.; ascend.

72.00 Top of spur ridge, bears N.E. and S.W.; descend.

80.47 (Proportional distance) Intersect the cor. of T. 33 N., Rs. 30 and 31 E., heretofore described.

Land mountainous.

Soil, rocky mixed with some loam; 3rd. rate.

Timber junipers; desert brush.

Mountainous land 80.47 chs.
