Sept. 11 **SUBDIVISION OF T. 32 N., R. 31 E.**

Sept. 11, 1912: At 8h. 30m. a.m. l.m.t., I set off 40° 35'N. on the lat. arc; 4°33'N. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the S. bdy., heretofore described; thence, I run

N.0°01'E., bet. secs. 31 and 32.


Ascend gradually over heavily rolling land.

Dry wash, 15 lks. wide, course S.E.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.;




dig pits, 18x18x12 ins., N. and S. of post, 3 ft. dist.; and raise a mound of earth, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

Same dry wash, 15 lks. wide, course S.25°W.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. dia., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32, with brass cap mkd.;



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

Land heavily rolling.

Soil sand and gravel mixed; 3rd. rate .

No timber; desert brush.

The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36 on the W. bdy. being plainly visible, I run for said cor. from last sec. cor.

N.89°56'W., on a random line bet. secs. 30 and 31.
