

Survey of the South Boundary of T. 35 N., R. 31 E.

- 80.00 Set a volcanic stone, $14 \times 8 \times 7$ ins., $9\frac{1}{2}$ ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 31 and 32, marked with 5 notches on the E. and 1 notch on W. edge; and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor.
- Land, mountainous.
Soil, rocky; 4 th rate.
No timber; undergrowth, desert brush.
Mountainous land, 80 chs.

Survey of the West Boundary of T. 34 N., R. 31 E.

Oct. 12, 1912: At 3⁰⁵ p.m. l.m.t., I set off $40^{\circ}45'$ N. on the lat. arc; and $7^{\circ}30'S$ on the decl. arc; and determine a true meridian with the solar, at the cor. of Ts. 33 and 34 N., Rs. 30 and 31 E., heretofore described.

North, bet. secs. 31 and 36.

11.00 Main wash, course W. S. W.

16.45 Old wagon trail, bears N. E. and S. W.

23.50 Dry wash, 20 lks. wide, course S. W.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.;
