

Retracement of the West Boundary of T. 35 N., R. 32 E.

I continue W. to the approximate position of the W. bdy. of T. 35 N., R. 32 E., and make diligent search for cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30. I find no evidence of old cor.

Retrace S. bet. secs. 25 and 30.

39.96 A redwood post, ^{wellset} 18x3x2 ins., marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general, bears E. 2.35 chs.

This being the first cor. found on the boundary, I begin measurement and line from said cor.

Continue south on retracement.

40.35 The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, which is a redwood post, 20x4x3 ins., wellset, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general, bears E. 21 lks. Therefore the bearing of last $\frac{1}{2}$ mile is S. 0° 18' E.

Continue same line

South, on retracement, bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Measure from point opposite old cor.

40.00 After diligent search, I fail to find any evidence of old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

81.20 The ^{old} cor. of Ts. 34 and 35 N., Rs. 31 and 32 E., bears E. 80 lks. An eruptive stone, 22x8x6 ins., marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.

The course of last mile is S. 0° 25' E. This cor is in lat. 40° 50' N., long. 118° 26' W.

October 2, 1912.

October 3, 1912: At 9^h 0^m a.m. l.m.t., I set off 40° 52' N., on the lat. arc; 3° 58 $\frac{3}{4}$ ' S. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar, at the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 30, above described. Thence I run
