General Description.

This fracl. township is rough and mountainous throughout. The mountains are rocky and barren of vegetation with the exception of a few scattering junipers on the higher mountain ranges. The mountains are known locally as the "East Range", they contain no water and the higher ridges and spurs are about 6000 ft. above sea level and about 2000 ft. above the Humbolt river valley. Secs. 22 and 27 contain quite large deposits of gypsum and sec. 35 contains Muckleberry mine from which some silver has been mined. The whole would be classified as mineral lands.
