I begin at the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33 on the S. ldy. of T. 30 N., R. 32 E., previously described:

Thence I retrace North bet. secs. 32 and 33 and at 40.00 Chains, make diligent search for the old $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 32 and 33 which I am unable to find. I continue north and at 80 chains find no traces of the old cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33. I continue my retracement north bet. secs. 28 and 29, bet. secs. 20 and 21, E. bet. secs. 16 and 21, north bet. secs. 15 and 16 and East bet. secs. 10 and 15, setting temp. points for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. and sec. cor. at intervals of 40.00 Chains, and making diligent search at these points for the old cor. The temp. cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15 falls upon a mound of earth, with evident remains of four pits in their proper places. I continue my retracement north from this point, finding no traces or evidence of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 10, and 11; the old cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, or the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 3. At 159.76 chains I intersect the sixth standard parallel, 0.74 chains West of the old standard cor. of secs. 33 and 34 of T. 31 N., R. 32 E. which
