search, I find no trace of the tp. cor. of T. 32 N.

August 7, 1912; I now proceed to the interior corner of secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29 and retrace North 4 miles to the N. bdy. of the tp. finding exidence of several interior corners and also the cor. on the N. bdy. of secs 4 and 5. From the said cor. of secs. 4 and 5, I run West and at 80.23 chs. after considerable search, I finally found remains of old juniper post, with distinct traces of old scribe marks, lying along side mound of earth with pits. I identify this as the original position of the cor. of secs. 5 and 6. From this cor. I run

West on the N. bdy. of sec. 6.

After diligent search, I failed to find any trace of old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

After again searching diligently, I failed to find any trace of the tp. cor. of T. 32 N., Rs. 31 and 32 E.
