

RETRACEMENT OF THE WEST BOUNDARY OF T. 31 N., R.32 E.

Chains

at the same point as follows:-

Set a schist rock, 28x26x5 ins., 20 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 18 and 19 marked with 3 notches on the N. and S. edges; and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, E. of cor.

I now set the instrument over the said cor. of secs. 18 and 19 above described, and continue to retrace North on a blank line, and at 40.00 chs.; at 80.00 chs.; at 120.00 chs.; at 160.00 chs.; at 200.00 chs. and at 240.00 chs., after diligent search, I failed to find any trace of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. or sec. corners or the tp. cor. of T. 31 N., Rs. 31 and 32 E. At 240.00 chs., I set a temp. cor. for cor. of T. 31 N., Rs. 31 and 32 E. From this temp. cor. I thence, retrace East, and 24.60 chs., after diligent search, I find no trace of the tp. cor. of T. 32 N. Rs. 31 and 32 E.

August 4 and 5, 1912.

August 7, 1912; I now proceed to the interior ^{re-established} corner of secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29 and retrace North 4 miles to the N. bdy. of the tp. finding evidence of several interior corners and also the cor. on the N. bdy. of secs 4 and 5. From the said cor. of secs. 4 and 5, I run West and at 80.23 chs. after considerable search, I finally found remains of old juniper post, with distinct traces of old scribe marks, lying along side mound of earth with pits. I identify this as the original position of the cor. of secs. 5 and 6. From this cor. I run

West on the N. bdy. of sec. 6.

40.00 After diligent search, I failed to find any trace of old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

52.94 After again searching diligently, I failed to find any trace of the tp. cor. of T. 32 N., Rs. 31 and 32 E.
