

RESURVEY OF THE EAST BOUNDARY OF T. 30 N., R. 33 E.

Chains

July 21, 1912: At 9h. 00m. a.m., l.m.t., I set off 40° 24½'N. on the lat. arc; 20°28½'N. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the closing cor. of Tps. 29 and 30 N., R. 34 E., heretofore described; thence, I resurvey N.1°59'E., on the W. bdy. sec. 31.

3.77 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 24 ins. in the ground, for ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 36 with brass cap mkd.;

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.

39.645 Re-established ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 31 as follows:-

Set an eruptive rock, 18x10x6 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for said ¼ sec. cor., marked ¼ on E. face; and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor. It was impossible to build a mound of stone on E. side of the corner on account of the slope of the mountain on E. side of cor. being too steep, and covered with slide rock.

43.77 Set an eruptive rock, 15x8x6 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for ~~corner~~ cor. of secs. 25 and 36, marked with 1 groove on S. and 5 grooves on N. face; and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor. The position of this ~~corner~~ corner was determined by calculating it due east of the interior cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34

79.29 Interscet the cor. of secs 30 and 31 heretofore described.
No topography taken.

Land mountainous, very rough.

Soil, none; mostly solid and slide rock.

No timber; dense desert and mountain brush.

Mountainous land ^{79.29} ~~80.00~~ chs.

From the cor. of secs. 30 and 31, I resurvey N.0°31'W., on W. bdy. of sec. 30.
