

Retracement of the North Boundary of T. 37 N., R. 34 E.

Chains.

Having received the field notes of boundaries S. and E. of T. 37 N., R. 33 E., I go to the temp. cor. of T. 37 N., Rs. 33 and 34 E., and retrace N. $89^{\circ}54'E$ along the N. bdy. of T. 37 N., R. 34 E. I run east several miles, making diligent search for all $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. and sec. cors. I fail to find any. This country is all loose, drifting sand; therefore I conclude that it is useless to search farther for cors.
Nov. 25, 1912.

Retracement of the N. bdy. of T. 36 N., R. 34 E.

It having been suggested by the surveyor general, I go to the west slope of Blue Mountain, and search for the cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, on the E. bdy. of T. 36 N., R. 34 E. After several hours search, I find the cor.. I return to camp, arriving after dark.
Nov. 26, 1912.

I go to the above named cor. and retrace north bet. secs. 1 and 6, T. 36 N., Rs. 34 and 35 E. I find the Tp. cor. of Ts. 36 and 37 N., Rs. 34 and 35 E., and retrace west bet. Ts. 36 and 37 N., R. 34 E.. I find no cors. until I get to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 33. This cor. is a redwood post, 24X2X2 ins., marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. From this cor., I run West, on a retracement, bet. secs. 4 and 33. I find no evidence of cor. of secs. 32, 33, 4 and 5.
