chains

with brass cap mkd.

dig pits 18 x 18 x 12 ins. E. and W. of post  
3 ft. dist. and raise a mound of earth

45.50 Ravine, course N.E.

52.10 Low mountain spur, slopes N.

64.10 Small ravine, course N.E.

68.10 Intersect the W. bdy of the tp. at N. 20° E

11.44 chs. from the cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins.  
diam. 24 ins. in the ground for closing  
corner of secs. 6 and 7, with brass cap mkd.

Soil, good desert loams, and thin and

E. 34.00 chs. is rolling land, with good  
soil, but too uneven to be easily cultivated  
W 34.10 chs. is mountainous, rocky and  
unfit for cultivation.

On entire distance is good growth sage-  
bush, little grass, no timber. Northwly  
slope.

I do not disturb the markings as ac-  
cessories of the cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12,  
since they are the same as for the cor.  
of secs. 7 and 12, but it is now the cor.  
of secs. 1 and 12, T38N, R21E.
