3½ ft. base, 1½ ft. high W. of cor.
Intersect the corner of sec. 19, 24, 25
and 30.

A basalt stone 5x6 ins. by 4 ins. above
ground. Firmly set in the ground,
marked with 4 notches on the north
and 2 notches on the south edge.

There were no accessories.

I dig pits 18x18x12 ins. in each sec.
5½ ft. dist.; and raise a mound of
earth 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high W. of cor.
Land, level.

Soil, sandy loam, good quality
Some short sage brush, land covered
with salt grass, interspersed with
patches of a better growth of wild
grass. General southerly slope.
