### General Description.

The sections included in this survey, namely sec. 33, 34, 35 and 36 are level, with a slight general S. E. slope. The soil is a sandy loam of good quality, very productive, when rightly irrigated and handled. Sections 33 and 34 are mostly cultivated fields while sec. 35 and 36 are used for grazing. Alfalfa is the chief crop raised, there is danger though of the water level raising to so near the surface that it will be unproductive. The water level now stands but a few feet below the surface. There are two settlers, L. L. Downs in sec. 33, and P. R. Downs in sec. 34.
