The southeastern portion of this township, which was subdivided, contains some level land, but mostly rugged mountainous land, the level land is in the south eastern portion of secs. 25 and 36. The vegetation of the township is scattering sage-brush and juniper, the juniper being on the higher ridges and mostly on the west slopes. The soil varies from a sandy loam to very stony. There is no water in the sections subdivided, but springs are near in secs. 2 and 3 on the south, and 23 and 27 on the west. One prospector is located in sec. 23 and another one in sec. 27. Mineral indications are found in all the secs. except 36. This mountain range is a continueation of the old Star Mining district. The entire western slope of the main ridge is located for prospecting purposes. Between secs. 26 and 27 good prospects of cinnabar are found and much development work is being done. Development work is also being carried on in secs. 33 and 34 and 24. The mountains indicate a highly mineralized district.
