General description.

Fract. T. 38 N., R. 34 E., lies in the valley between the Jackson mountains on the west and the Silver State mountain range on the east and about midway between the Humboldt river on the south and the Quinn river on the north. It also lies in the north edge of a belt of drifting sand dunes extending east and west for about sixty miles across Humboldt county. The soil is exceptional sandy and much of it worthless for farm purposes or grazing. The land is generally level and covered with low sage-brush and grease-wood. There is a horse power pump and well in sec. 24, of good water, said to be about 60 ft. deep, otherwise the township is dry.
