

Resurvey of E. Bdy. of T27N, R35E.
(Humboldt River Guide Meridian)

chains

- 310 Draw, 20 lks. wide, course
S 35° E, ascends.
- 16.40 Top of spur, bears S 30° E., and
N 30° W., descends.
- 24.60 Draw, 20 lks. wide, course
S 80° E., ascends.
- 32.92 Top of spur bears E. and W.,
descends.
- 39.68 The old $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 31 and 36,
which is a granite rock, her-
etofore described, is now a $\frac{1}{4}$ cor
for sec 36.
- Land, mountainous.
Soil, sandy and rocky,
3rd and 4th rates.
Undergrowth, sage brush
and scattering Juniper
No timber.

May - 23 - 1913

Re survey of E. Bdy. of T27N, R35E.
(Humboldt River Guide Meridian)

May - 20 - 1913: at 9^h 0^m a.m., l.m.t., I set
off 40° 09' on the lat. arc, 19° 58' N,
on the decl arc., and determine
a meridian with the solar, at
cor. of Tps. 26 and 27 N, R 35 and 36
E, which is an iron post, her-
etofore described.

Thence I run
North bet. secs 31 and 36 on a
blank line. At 4000 and 8000
ch. points. I find no evidence of
old corners. I continue building
temp. cor. At 6 miles 59 lks.
fall 71 lks. E of cor. of Tps. 27 and 28
N, R 35 and 36 E.
