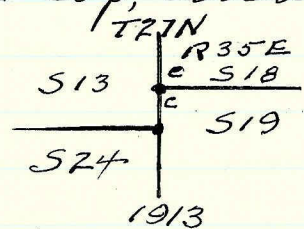


Subdivision of T27N, R35E.

- chains raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, N. of cor. Pits impracticable.
- 50.50 Enter wash, 40 lbs. wide, 7 ft. deep, course, 565° E.
- 57.10 Enter wash 30 lbs. wide, 6 ft. deep, course 540° E.
Ascend N.E. slope.
- 74.10 Top of spur. bears 560° E. and N 60° W. Descend S.W. slopes
- 80.50 Enter wash 15 lbs. wide, 5 ft. deep, course, 515° E.
Ascend gentle slopes
- 86.16 Intersect W. bdy. of Tp. 310 chs. N 0° 02' E of cor. of secs. 13 and 24, which is a stone heretofore described.
Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam, 24 ins. in ground, for closing cor. of secs. 18 and 19. with brass cap, marked,

- Thence Iron
N 0° 09' W, on a true line bet. secs. 17 and 18.
Ascend steep south slope over large rocks.
- 4.00 Top of rocky ridge, 600 ft. high, bears N 55° W. and S 55° E.
Descend steep slope.
- 27.70 Enter wash 15 lbs. wide, 10 ft. deep. course E. Ascend short slope
