- raise a mound of stone, 2 ft base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor. Pits impracticable.
- 40.85 Wash, 20 lbs wide, course, S. 80° E.
Ascend steep slope.
- 67.80 Top of divide, 800 ft. high, bears N. and S.
Descend gradually.
- 81.00 Head of rocky canyon, course S 10° W.
Ascend gradually.
- 86.20 Intersect the W. bdy of Tp., 1.84 chs, N 0° 02' E., of cor. of secs. 12 and 13, which is a granite rock heretofore described.
The point of intersection falls on a granite rock in place, 36 x 20 x 2 ins. above ground, for closing cor. of secs. 7 and 18., I mark a (X) at the exact point, CC on the east; with 2 grooves on N; and 4 grooves on the S side; and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft high, E. of cor. Pits impracticable.
