

Retracement of West Bdy. of T 28N, R 35E.

June 2-1913: at 8⁰⁰ am, Lmt., I set off $40^{\circ}15'$ on the lat. arc; $22^{\circ}11'$ N. on the decl. arc; and determine a true meridian with the solar, at the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor. of ^{sec} 36, T 28N, R 34E, which is 5.50 chs N $0^{\circ}23'W$ of the SW. cor. of T 28N, R 35E, which is an iron post heretofore described. Thence I retrace N.; and at 39.32 chs., fall 16 lbs. east of cor. to secs. 25 and 36, which is a lava rock $12 \times 12 \times 20$ ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general, the line bears N $0^{\circ}14'W$.

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Thence I retrace N. along the east bdy of sec. 25., and at 39.82 chs., fall 38 lbs. E. of $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 25, which is a quartz rock $8 \times 10 \times 20$ ins. above ground marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general; the line bears N $0^{\circ}33'W$; and at 39.62 chs. ^{North} from $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor. fall 4 lbs. E. of cor. to secs. 24 and 25, which is a quartz rock $14 \times 16 \times 24$ ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general, therefore the line bears N $0^{\circ}03'W$.

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Thence I retrace N. along the east bdy of sec. 24. and at 39.61 chs. fall 17 lbs. E. of $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 24, which is quartz rock $12 \times 18 \times 30$ ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general; the line bears N $0^{\circ}15'W$; and at 40.11 chs. ^{North} from $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor. fall 6 lbs. W. of cor. to secs. 13 and 24, which is a
