

Resurvey of E Bdy of T28N R35E.

(Humboldt River Guide Meridian)

Surveyed by Alex. J. Harris

chains

June 5 - 1913: at 8⁴⁵ a.m. I set off 40°15' on the lat. arc, 22°33'N. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar, at the cor. of Tps. 27 and 28N, Rs 35 and 36E, which is an iron post here-
tofore described. Lat 40°15'N. Long 117°39'W. Mag. Dec. 1919E.

Thence I run

North on a random line,

40.00

No evidence of old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor

Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor.

80.00

Set temp cor of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36.

80.55

Find old decayed stake 34 lks. W. of line. As there is no sub-division depending on this line on either side, I continue North on random line setting temporary points at 40.00 and 80.00 chs., destroying all evidence of old corners.

Start

Find 27 lks. E. of cor. of Tps. 28 and 29N, Rs 35 and 36E, which is an iron post here-tofore described. June 5-1913

Thence I run

50°02'E. on a true line bet secs. 1 and 6

Over level sandy ground, through scattering sage brush and grease wood

Leave sage brush enter dry lake bed, bears NE and SW.

No vegetation

Set iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 24 ins. in ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor., with brass cap. marked,
