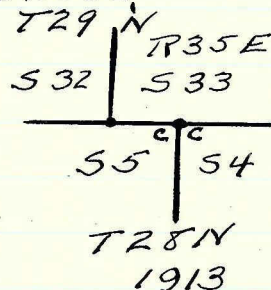


Subdivision of T28N, R35E.

chains

- 61.30 Enter wash, 20 lks. wide, 3 ft. deep, course $N75^{\circ}E$.
- 64.70 Enter wash, 20 lks. wide, 4 ft. deep, course E.
- 74.50 Enter wash, 20 lks. wide, 5 ft. deep, course $S80^{\circ}E$.
- 81.34 Intersect the N. bdy. of Tp. 33 lks. $N89^{\circ}47'E$ of cor. of secs. 32 and 33., which is an iron post heretofore described. Set iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 in. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 4 and 5, with brass cap. marked.



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor. 2 and, rolling.

Soil, sandy and stony; 3rd and 4th rate.

Vegetation, sage brush.

June 11-1913

Surveyed by Alex. J. Lewis

June 10-1913: at 9^h 0^m a.m. Mt. I set off $40^{\circ}15'$ on the lat. arc, $23^{\circ}01'N$, on the decl arc; and determine a meridian with the solar. at cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, which is an iron post heretofore described.

Thence I run

$N0^{\circ}06'W$, bet secs. 31 and 32 Over rolling ground, through sage brush.

.25 Road, tears, E and W.

1.50 Enter wash, 30 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course E., ascend.
