

Subdivision of T 28 N, R 35 E.

General Description.

The surface of the ground in east part of township is a level alkali flat, entirely destitute of vegetation.

In the western part, the surface is mountainous, mostly of volcanic formation.

Between the mountainous land the surface is rolling, with general drainage toward the east.

The rolling ground is covered with heavy growth of sage brush and grease wood, while the mountainous land has a growth of sage brush.

There is no water or timber in this township.

American canyon in the western part of the township, is the site of an old placer camp, which is practically worked out now. A few other places in the west part are being prospected for placer and quartz, but no development or discoveries have been made. In the north part of sec. 18. near the summit of the ridge, two or three prospectors, are working for placer gold, in what they think might be an old channel of American canyon.

There are no settlers in this township. The soil is mostly sandy. In the west part it is a sandy loam mixed with small gravelly and larger stones.

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
