

General Description of T. 39 N., R. 36 E.

This frac'l. township lies in the valley between the Santa Rosa mountains on the east and the Silver State range on the west. The soil in this township is a sandy loam and apparently very fertile. It is fairly well covered with a good growth of sage-brush. The west part of the township lies in the foothills of the Silver State mountain range where considerable mining operations are in progress. Ore is being hauled to a mill located in the N. part of sec. 2. A well of excellent water has been developed at the mill, at a depth of 45 feet. Mr. Chester, The foreman at the mill stated that an average of 45,000 gallons of water per day has been pumped from the well for a period of 3 months. There are no settlers in the valley at the present time, but a movement is in progress for the colonization of the entire valley. There is a mining camp in sec. 4 known as "Wakening" and a townsite being laid out at the mill to be called "Davey Town".
