

Resurvey of N. Bdy. of T30N, R37E. 6th Standard Parallel N.

chains.

July-15-1913: at 2^h 0^m p.m., l.m.t., I set off 40° 30' N. on the lat. arc; 21° 32' N. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the standard cor. of secs. 32, and 33, which is an iron post. heretofore described.

Thence I retrace

W., along the S. bdy. of sec. 32.

4.80 I find no trace of the closing cor. of secs. 4 and 5.

40.00 I find no trace of $\frac{1}{4}$ standard cor. of sec 32., and at 79.80 chs. fall 65 lbs. N. of standard cor. of secs. 31 and 32, which is a juniper stake 3x3x24 ins. badly decayed, set in a mound of earth. The line bears S 89° 32' W.

July-15-1913

July-16-1913: at 8^h 0^m a.m., l.m.t., I set off 40° 30' N. on the lat. arc; 21° 25' N. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar, at the standard cor. of secs. 31 and 32.

Thence I run

W., along the S. bdy. of sec. 31, at 40.00 chs. I find no trace of $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.; and at 77.80 chs. fall 74 lbs. N. of standard cor. of T. 31N, R. 36 and 37E., which is a juniper post 3x3x24 ins. loosely set in mound of stone, and marked as described by the surveyor general. The line bears ^{apoint} S 89° 28' W. at 79.76 chs. intersect 75 lbs. N. of the old closing cor. of Twp. 30 N. R. 36 + 37 E. which is a juniper stake marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. I rebuild this cor. at same point as follows:-
