

Subdivision of T. 30 N. R. 37 E.

General Description.

This frac. township lies in the East Range of the Humboldt mountains and consists of rolling hills and low mountains.

The soil is gravelly and stony with volcanic ash subsol.

The formation is generally of volcanic origin and the top of the hills are lava capped. The vegetation consists of low scattering sagebrush with scattering juniper trees in N.W. part.

There are indications of mineral in secs. 5-6-7 and 8 and a small creek of good water in secs. 8 and 9. An old territorial trail from Bulls Mountain to Unionville crosses the fraction. There are no agricultural lands.
