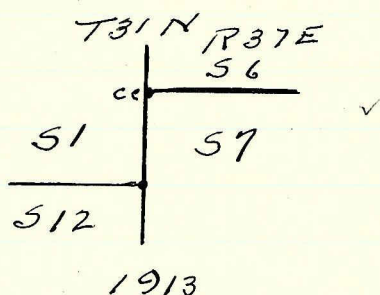
49.00 Gulch, 20 lbs. wide, course NW; ascend.

54.00 Top of spur, bears NW, and SE; descend.

57.00 Head of Gulch 10 lbs. wide, course NW; ascend.

71.83 Intersect the W. bdy. of Tp. 796 chs. $140^{\circ}42'E$ of cor. of secs. 1 and 12, which is an iron post heretofore described.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of secs. 6 and 7, with brass cap. marked,
