

General Description.

This Township is mostly rough and mountainous. The north east cor. of Township is level and rolling, this rolling land extends south westerly through parts of sec. 1, 2, 11, 12, 13, 14, 23, 24 and 26. The mountainous land is a sandy loam and very stony, some parts are of 2nd rate, but mostly 3rd and 4th rate. The vegetation of the township is sage brush, scattering juniper; and bunch grass up near the high ridges. The high ridges furnish good grazing during the spring time. There are several springs in this township which affords plenty of water for stock being pastured on the hills. Part of sections 6 and 7 is fenced off for pasture land, by Eugene Thacker.

Mineral indications have been found in the western part of the township. Gold has been found in section 5 and is now being worked by a miner who lives in the N.E. cor. of sec. 8. Prospect holes show mineral indications in sections 6, 7 and 8, but none of these are now being worked.

There are no settlers in this fractional township, one prospect on in sec. 8, one deserted cabin in sec. 21, also one in section 18.

The springs in the township furnish a small amount of
