

Resurvey

South bdy. T. 32 N., R. 37 E.

Chains July 15, 1913.

The cor. of Tps. 31 and 32 N., Rs. 37 and 38 E. being just a trace of earth mound and pits and a decayed pine post with markings obliterated I destroy same, and at the same point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for a new township cor., with a brass cap, marked

Dig pits 24 X 24 X 12 ins. N., E. and W. of post, on line 4 ft. dist., and S. 8 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth, 5 ft. base, 2½ ft. high, S. of cor.

At 9h., a. m., 1. m. t., I set off 21° 34' N. on the decl. arc. and 40° 35' N. on the lat. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar: (This can be done by 17° 35' N. long. 117° 45' W.)

Thence I retrace

West on a random line bet. secs. 1 and 36.

40.00 After diligent search I am unable to find any trace of the old ¼ sec. cor., I set temp. cor. and continue my line.

80.00 Intersect the old cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, which is a decayed pine post, markings obliterated, set in a trace of an earth mound.

Course of this mile is west.

West on a random line bet. secs. 2 and 35.

40.00 After diligent search fail to find any trace of the old ¼ sec. cor., I set temp ¼ cor. and continue line.

80.00 Find partly decayed pine post lying on ground 2 lks. S. of my 80.00 ch. point, scribe marks partly legable, and possible trace of mound and pits.
