


Retracement  
Resurvey of the E. bdy. of T. 37 N., R. 38 E.

Chains

August 26, 1913.  
The cor. of Tps. 36 and 37 N., Rs. 38 and 39 E. is very nearly obliterated, a trace of mound and pits remaining, therefore I destroy all trace of the old cor. and at the same point  
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for a new township cor., with a brass cap marked

Dig pits 24 X 24 X 12 ins. on line, N., E. and W., 4 ft. dist. and S. 8 ft. and raise a mound of earth, 5 ft. base, 2½ ft. high, S. of cor.

Thence I run on retracement

North bet. secs. 31 and 36.

40.00 After diligent search, find no trace of the ¼ sec. cor.

80.70 Intersect 14 lks. E. of the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36., which is a pine stake, 3 X 3 ins. 16 ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described by thr surveyor general.

Course of this mile is N. 0° 06' W.

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Beginning at the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, at 9h., 30m., a. m., 1. m. t., I set off 10° 29' N. on the decl. arc, and 41° 02' N. on the lat. arc and determine a meridian with the solar

Thence I run

North on retracement bet. secs. 25 and 30.

40.20 Intersect ¼ sec. cor., which is a pine post, 2½ X 2½ ins., 18 ins. above ground, marks obliterated, set in a trace of an earth mound.

I continue line north
